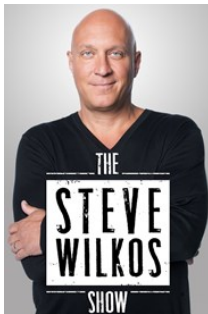

If you haven't tried Ballroom Dance but would like to, come join us for an evening of fun!! Singles and couples are welcome.

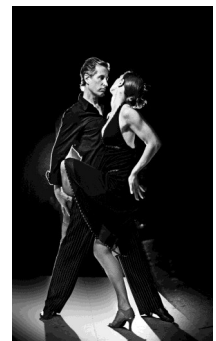
