## **COURSE SYLLABUS**

**Course Title:** Orientation to Deafness **Course #:** DSC\* 110

## Course Description: 3 Semester Hours

An overview of deafness that encompasses 3 major topics: the nature and experience of deafness; the education of deaf children and adults; and the adult Deaf community. Medical, educational, psychological, social, and vocational aspects are considered.

**<u>Pre-requisite/Co-requisite:</u>** Prerequisite: Eligibility for ENG\* 101

- **Goals:** 1. To become familiar with the diversity of the deaf communities such as Deaf/deaf, hard of hearing, and late-deafened and interface with the "larger" society.
  - Anatomy, Physiology, Assessment and Habilitation of the Ear
  - Genetic and acquired forms of hearing loss
  - 2. To gain an overview of the history of Deaf peoples' lives.
    - Educational access through history
    - US Laws that pertain to Deaf and Special Education
    - Linguistic and communication variations/options for Deaf and Hard of hearing people
  - 3. To make an acquaintance with various agencies and services affiliated with the Deaf people.
  - 4. To demonstrate beginning analysis of oppressed traits/experiences.
    - Linguistic control of the minority
    - Employment issues
    - ADA and its impact on oppression of Deaf people

### **<u>Outcomes</u>**: Upon successful completion of the course, students should be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate comprehension of specialized terminology.
- 2. Read the basic information of an audiogram
- 3. Describe the function and benefits of hearing aids
- 4. Identify the 4 main causes of hearing loss
- 5. Identify and compare benefits of the various communication options for people with hearing loss
- 6. Identify federals and state organization and agencies of the Deaf and work with Deaf people.
