

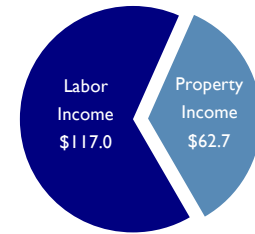

NCCC Stimulates Economic Growth

- NCCC’s past and present activities in the work force account for \$117.0 million in labor income (i.e., wages, salaries, and benefits) and \$62.7 million in property income (i.e., dividends, interest, and rent) of the region’s current economy.
- Altogether, the NCCC impact region economy owes roughly \$179.7 million of its current income to the annual operations of NCCC and the cumulative effects of its past students.

NCCC Raises Consumer Spending

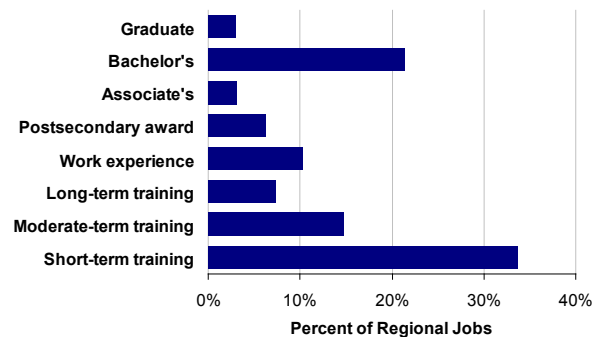


- NCCC employed 105 full-time and 150 part-time faculty and staff during FY 2006-07, with an annual payroll of \$12.5 million.
- NCCC had a total operating budget of \$15.3 million, of which \$12.6 million (or 83%) was spent in the local region.
- NCCC students who commuted to the impact region to attend college generated an estimated \$87,500 in sales while in the area to pay for books and supplies.

NCCC Creates a Skilled Work Force

- NCCC activities encourage new business, assist existing business, and create long-term economic growth. The college enhances worker skills and provides customized training to local business and industry.
- It is estimated that the present-day NCCC impact region work force embodies about 417,800 credit hours of past and present NCCC training. These added skills promote business productivity and increase regional income.
