Greenwoods Memorial Garden



Help Fund the Memorial Garden!

Purpose: To be erected in March 2019, the memorial is being built by students with the help of the Student Activities Director as a space for reflection and remembrance of those who had have a lasting impact on Northwestern. After the unfortunate passing of Steve Rines, students wished to plant a memorial in his honor with tulip bulbs purchased through the Tobacco Free Campus Grant. The garden concept now has settled on a space to not only honor and remember Mr. Rines but anyone who has left their footprint on Northwestern.

Location: The hillside behind Greenwoods Hall.

Description of Proposed Garden: The garden will be a 10ft wide circle with yellow tulips, a ring of custom bricks, low laying native shrubs and a tree will be placed in the center surrounded by mulch. A plaque will be placed at the bottom of the circle noting what the memorial is. Custom ordered bricks can be purchased by February 25th, 2019 for the initial installation. Future and ongoing brick orders will be made available annually.

Initial Fundraising & Ongoing Expenses- The initial cost is estimated to be approximately \$1,200 - \$1500 for materials. Custom bricks (order form below) are being sold to fund the garden and to provide for ongoing expenses to maintain the garden. Payments can be made NCCC with Memorial Garden in the memo line and sent to student activities with the order form completed. After the initial installation this spring bricks will be placed at an annual ceremony each fall.


